

REGULATORY MATTERS

A reminder once again to all applicants on grant applications to ensure that their research is in compliance with institute-wide and national regulatory norms.

You will require regulatory approvals if your work involves:

- ✓ Recombinant DNA
- ✓ Genetically modified organisms
- ✓ Animals
- ✓ Stem cells
- ✓ Human tissue
- ✓ *Human tissue and international collaborations/funding

*Research involving the use of samples derived from patients and international collaborations or funding from overseas agencies will require clearance via the HMSC.

All regulatory approvals should ideally be in place at the time of submission of the grant proposal. If this is not the case, the grant submission should be followed by a parallel submission of the required papers to the regulatory committees.

DBT

Notification (DBT /PCAH/Gen/01) dated 7-June-2012 DBT has made it MANDATORY for the beneficiaries of the public and private organizations to acknowledge the financial support received from DBT via inclusion of its Reference/Grant number (e.g. BT/INF/2211 /2007), Name of the Department and the duration of the financial support including the dates, under acknowledgement section of scientific publications, Patents and Technology transfer documents etc. (wherever permitted by law).

DST-SERB

(http://serb.gov.in/pdfs/format/terms-andconditions.pdf)

Investigators are encouraged to publish technical/ scientific papers based on the research work done under the project in journals of high repute. They should formally acknowledge the assistance received from SERB. The PI also has the responsibility of informing the Board about any papers published from the project implementation even after the completion of the project tenure. A soft copy of the technical paper published should be sent to the SERB.

Council for Scientific Research (http://csirhrdg.nic.in/res_grants.htm#j)

Acknowledgement of the support given by CSIR in all the publications arising from the work done under the scheme. CSIR should be acknowledged in similar type of other published work/press reports etc.

Board of Research in Nuclear Sciences (BRNS), Department of Atomic Energy

The Awardee should send a copy of the manuscript of the papers to the Scientific Secreatry/Programme Officer, BRNS, DAE simultaneously while forwarding the paper to the journal. The paper should acknowledge the financial assistance provided by BRNS, DAR and quote the sanction number of the project. Three reprints of all papers published should be forwarded to the Scientific Secretary/Programme Officer, BRNS, DAE

To assist the Alliance in tracking the outputs of research to which it has contributed either wholly or in part, the Alliance's contributions must be acknowledged in all publications.

Human Frontiers in Science Program (http://www.hfsp.org/sites/www.hfsp.org/files/HFSP%20Matters%204.pdf)

May 4 Issue HFSP Newsletter- "Altmetrics are everywhere: Citing HFSP support" By Guntram Bauer, Director of Scientific Affairs and Communications

Publications arising from work funded by HFSP should acknowledge the full name of the organization, "Human Frontier Science Program", rather than the acronym "HFSP". In addition, to effectively track the output of HFSP funded research, PIs are required to mention the full award number (e.g., LT000096/2011-C or RGP0012/2010). In the rare case that there is no specific award field, a short sentence could be added to the acknowledgements such as 'This work was supported by the Human Frontier Science Program [award number].'

Indo-French Centre for the Promotion of Advanced Research (IFCPAR/CEFIPRA)

The scientists concerned are encouraged to publish their results, with due acknowledgement to IFCPAR. In such acknowledgements the name of the Centre in full in English and in French (Indo-French Centre for the Promotion of Advanced Research/Centre Franco-Indien Pour la Promotion de la Recheche Avancee) should appear. Twelve copies of each such publication shall be forwarded to Director, IFCPAR, within a period of one month from the date of publication.

USA: Eco-Devo-Eco Network Research exchange funds (EDEN-RCN)

Remit: For exchange visits to facilitate collaborations between USA and other countries involving research on emerging model organisms, tools and techniques.

Budget: Travel and living cost

Applicant Eligibility: Faculty (with priority given to early-career faculty) of any

nationality and from any institution

Duration: 3 Months




